Outcome for Participants

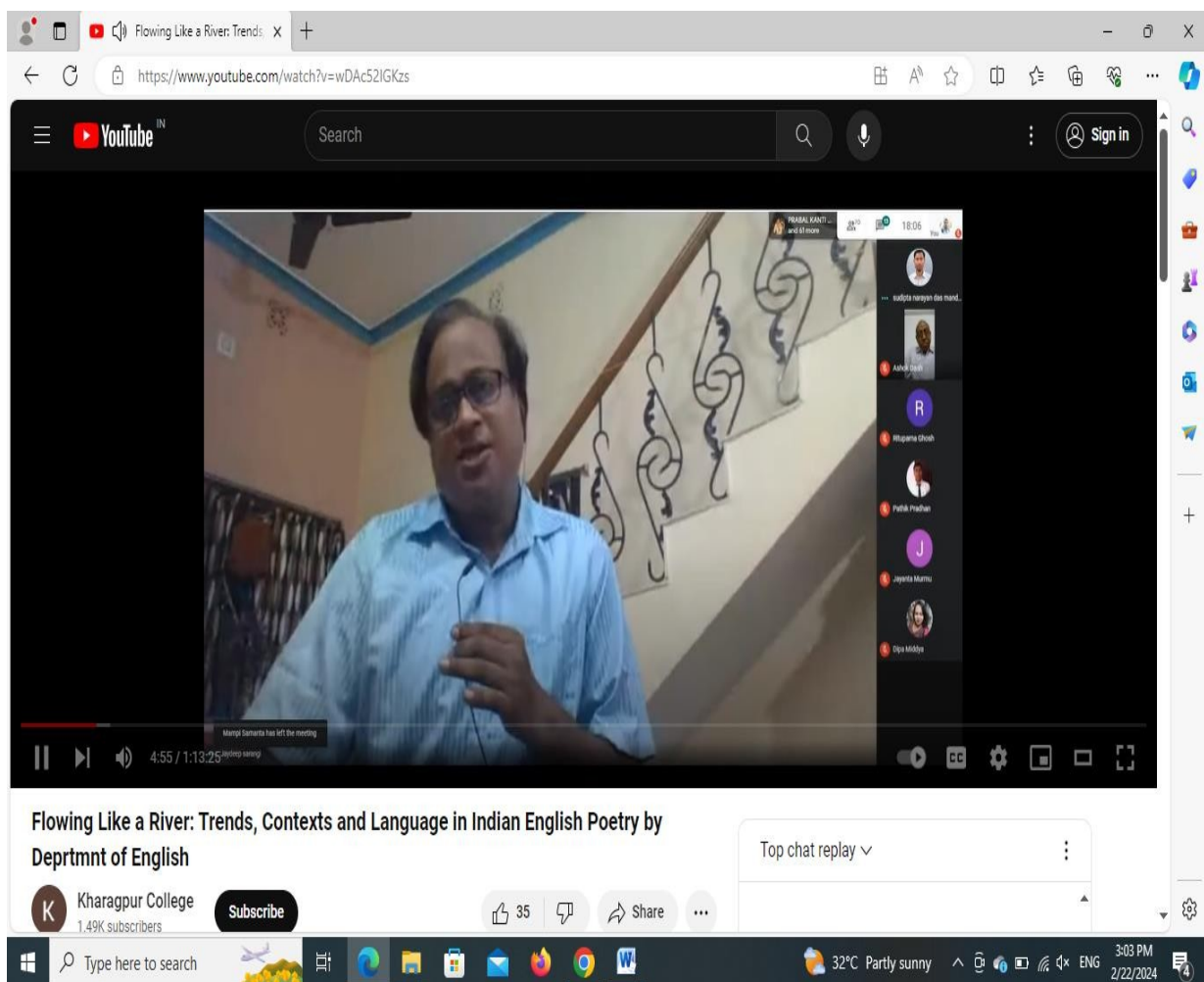
